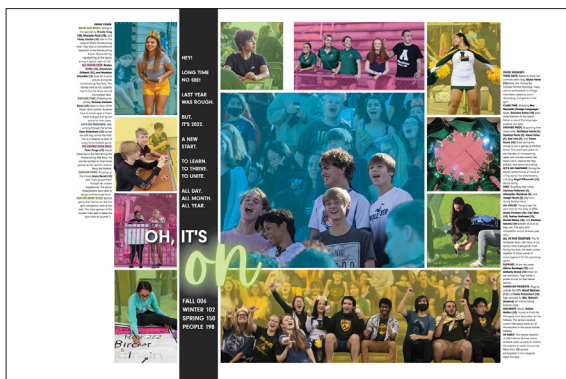


# DESIGN CANVA WOW

## EXTRA REMINDER

As always, your **high-res PDF** is your ultimate guide to what will print in your yearbook. Please be sure to print and closely examine your PDF to make sure you like what you see.

## INSTRUCTIONS

Starting in eDesign Page Design, **draw or select an empty image frame** to work with and make two exact copies. *Tip: Hold the Option/Alt key and drag to easily make a copy.*

In the original frame, drag, drop, and crop your full image. *Note the "scaling percentage" of your finished image (this number appears in the cropping panel.)*

In the second frame, **apply a fill color and transparency** you want to "overlay" the image.

**Place the color frame** perfectly on top of the image. You can use the align tools to make sure it's perfectly aligned on all edges.

Open the **original image into Canva** from either the library or page design. *It will not overwrite the original; it will save an edited copy.*

When your image loads into Canva, click **Edit Image** and select the **BG Remover**. *Use the Erase and Restore options to clean it up.*

When done, click **Apply** and wait for the edited image to save. *Restore Original will appear as a cue that the edits have saved.*

Click **Publish** to send the cutout back to the eDesign Library.

**Drag and drop the cutout** into the third frame. **Crop your image** to the same "zoom percentage" as your original image.

Put this third frame on top of the other two. *Use the align tools and arrow keys to help you make this overlay perfect.*

**Select all three frames** at once and **group together** so that no one accidentally moves them apart. *If you need to edit this in any way, be sure to ungroup them first so that you can do so.*
